When reviewing policies and procedures, we always consult with our colleagues to ensure that those involved in activities can positively influence the outcome before making any changes. In addition, we'll always communicate changes affecting our health and safety arrangements in various ways to the target audience to ensure the changes are fully understood and effective.

Our business policies and procedures have evolved and are subject to formal review to ensure they remain compliant with Government legislation, best practice and findings from our periodic review and audit processes.
